### As Principal of Farmington River, what does your job entail?


My job entails a lot. First is student and staff safety. I am also responsible for the supervision and evaluation of staff. My job is to work with teachers to deliver the most effective instruction for *ALL* students. My job is also to be the ambassador for the district.

I hold four core beliefs about education:

- Student Development and Achievement is our primary purpose, and we must be accountable for all students' learning and growth at high levels.
- *Parental Engagement* supports and maintains the educational process, while setting a personal and character-development standard for students.
- The Teaching and Learning Environment is the pathway to establish positive school experiences and to motivate students to dream big and work hard.
- Finally, we must aim to *Make Learning Relevant* to the student's life or interest.

# Can you tell us how you feel about working at Farmington River, and what your goals are in your position?

Every day I am still amazed at what happens in this school. The staff are dedicated and hard working. The level of community support coupled with a great PTA make FRRSD just a great place to work and learn. I think the best part is having that private-school feel in a public school. You don't get this feeling in larger schools. As for goals, I would like to see each student receive an education that meets their specific need—no matter where they are. I feel education needs to meet the student where they are; not the reverse. In an

visiting classrooms throughout the day,

to dismissal when I'm outside saying goodbye—it's all great.
